ASU Prep Phoenix 7-12 is the secondary division of ASU Prep Phoenix, a comprehensive K-12 public charter school and part of the ASU Preparatory Academy network, chartered by Arizona State University. Together with our K-6 program, we share a unified commitment to preparing every student for success in college, career, and life through innovative, personalized learning experiences that challenge students to think critically, solve complex problems, and become lifelong learners.

ASU Prep Phoenix is one of several site-based schools within the ASU Preparatory Academy network. Campuses are located throughout Arizona, including Mesa (K-12), Phoenix (K-12), South Phoenix (PreK-12), Casa Grande (7-12), Pilgrim Rest (PreK-6), and ASU Prep Digital (K-12).

The student body at ASU Prep Phoenix 7-12 is culturally diverse, with a population that is 69.2% Hispanic, 16.92% African American, 7.38% White, 1.52% Asian, 2.60% American Indian/Alaska Native, and 2.17% Other/Multiracial. We celebrate the diverse backgrounds, perspectives, and experiences of our students and families, creating an inclusive community where every learner belongs.

At ASU Prep, our mission is to design innovative models for educational success while raising academic achievement for all learners. We accomplish this by personalizing learning, fostering student agency, and creating meaningful experiences that prepare students to thrive in college, career, and life.

Academic Program

ASU Preparatory Academy's program is designed to help students develop the knowledge, skills, and confidence needed for success beyond graduation. Students engage in learning experiences that foster:

- Strong foundational knowledge across all core content areas
- Effective reading, writing, communication, and collaboration skills
- Critical thinking and analytical reasoning
- Creative problem-solving and real-world application
- Independence, resilience, and ownership of learning

High school students have opportunities to earn up to 45 college credits through Arizona State University's Universal Learner Courses and other dual enrollment pathways, allowing them to begin their college journey before graduation.

Rank

School policy does not allow for individual ranking and instead ranks students based on grade point average percentage in the class; GPA for Summa Cum Laude - 3.8+; GPA for Magna Cum Laude - 3.6 - 3.79; GPA for Cum Laude - 3.4 - 3.59.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA is calculated based on adding all points earned and dividing the total points by the total number of courses taken. All grades, starting in the students' freshman year, count toward their cumulative GPA. Honors and concurrent courses are awarded an extra grade point for a grade of A, B, C, up to a maximum of 5 points. Grades are recorded at the end of the fall and spring term. At ASU Prep Phoenix, 22 credits are required for graduation.
