About ASU Prep Phoenix

ASU Preparatory Academy is an innovative K-12 school where teachers, students and families share the same goal – college graduation. Located in the Phoenix Metro area and chartered by Arizona State University, the district has a diversified student population.

ASU Prep Phoenix is part of the network of site-based schools in Arizona. Currently, ASU Preparatory Academy campuses are located in Mesa (K-12), Phoenix (K-12), South Phoenix (PreK-12), Casa Grande (7-12), Pilgrim Rest (PreK-6), and Digital (K-12). The student body of ASU Preparatory Academy Phoenix is culturally diverse, with a population that is 74% Hispanic, 15% African American, 6% white, 2% Asian, and 3% American Indian/Alaskan Native. The mission of ASU Prep Downtown Phoenix is to design new models for educational success and raise academic achievement for all learners. At ASU Prep, that means personalizing project-based learning to help students gain valuable critical thinking skills.

School

ASU Preparatory Academy for Downtown Phoenix is a comprehensive, free, public charter school serving grades K-12. Located in Downtown Phoenix, Arizona, the school opened in the Fall of 2009. ASU Preparatory Academy for Downtown Phoenix graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2015 and is accredited by Cognia.

Academic Program

ASU Preparatory Academy's program includes a curriculum that is designed to help students build:

- Foundational knowledge and confidence for further study
- Learning skills to be able to read, write, and speak clearly and accurately
- Critical thinking skills to observe, interpret, and analyze information

Rank

School policy does not allow for individual ranking and instead ranks students based on grade point average percentage in the class; GPA for Summa Cum Laude - 3.8+; GPA for Magna Cum Laude - 3.6 - 3.79; GPA for Cum Laude -3.4 - 3.59.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA is calculated based on adding all points earned and dividing the total points by the total number of courses taken. All grades, starting in the students' freshman year, count toward their cumulative GPA.

Honors and concurrent courses are awarded an extra grade point for a grade of A, B, C, up to a maximum of 5 points. Grades are recorded at the end of the fall and spring term. At ASU Prep Phoenix, 22 credits are required for graduation.

The academic program is organized on a traditional schedule. Six classes, 3.0 credits per semester is the maximum course load at a given time. Students who complete a half-credit course earlier than the allotted time frame are eligible to take more courses. Students may accelerate and complete a course at any time. There is a minimum 3-week seat-time requirement. Students work an average of 5-6 hours per course weekly. Students attend classes and complete coursework at any time throughout the week. Live Lessons are held Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. until
